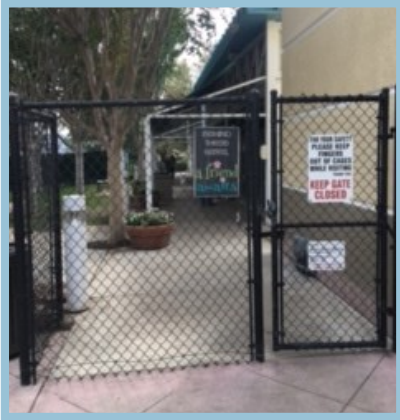


Mission Viejo Animal Services Center Hours

The Mission Viejo Animal Services Center is a pro-humane facility where animals are cared for until they're reunited with their owners or until they can be placed in a new, permanent home.

Our mission is to improve and safeguard the health, safety and welfare of animals and people.

Below are some of the services we provide

- Protection of public health against contagious, infectious, or communicable animal diseases.
- Rabies Control
- Quarantine of animals involved in bites to humans.
- Enforcement of local and state laws
- Patrol of public streets and parks
- Impoundment of stray animals
- Adoption of shelter animals
- Owner relinquishment program
- Community outreach presentations
- Wildlife education
- Nuisance complaint investigations



A license and microchip is your pet's ticket home

All dogs over the age of four (4) months in our service area are required to have and wear a current license tag. (Cat licenses are recommended but not required by law.) Your pet's license is proof of its valid rabies vaccination as well as its best chance to get home safely if lost.

To purchase a license, you must provide proof of your pet's current rabies vaccination. If your pet has been spayed or neutered, you may license it at a reduced rate by providing proof of alteration. Pet owners over the age of 55 may license their pets at a reduced rate by providing proof of their age.

To purchase a new license, you can do it in person at the Mission Viejo Animal Services Center, or mail us the printable License Application available on our website.

Vaccine and microchip clinics

Volunteer Opportunities

The Mission Viejo Animal Services Center is always accepting applications for volunteers to assist with essential volunteer duties at the center. While volunteering at the center can be extremely rewarding, the job can be very physically demanding. The following is a brief description of the requirements and duties for volunteering.



1. Volunteer opportunities include: Dog Walking, and cat and rabbit care
2. All volunteers must be at least 18 years of age or older.
3. Volunteers are required to get a tetanus shot or provide proof of a shot within 30 days.
4. Volunteers are required to work one 3-hour shift per week on a specified day and time.
5. Volunteers are required to provide a one-year commitment to the program.
