



Your Rights Under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 provides that “no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance.” Related statutes provide protection against discrimination on the basis of sex, age, and disability.

Any person who believes they have been discriminated against may file a written complaint to the City of Rancho Santa Margarita, the Federal Highways Administration (FHWA), or the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) within 180 days of the alleged discrimination.
