

Temporary Sign
Quick-Reference Guide

CITY OF RANCHO SANTA MARGARITA

Businesses may display temporary banners subject to certain regulations. These regulations are in place to maintain the aesthetic quality of the community.

If you plan to use a temporary banner sign for your business, you need to obtain a permit from the City. Please remember to follow these steps:

- Download the Temporary Banner Application from the City's website, or by following this link:

- Bring the application to the City's Planning counter during business hours to obtain a permit before displaying your banner.

Banners are subject to the following restrictions:

- Permitted banners may be displayed for a maximum of 10 days; each business may apply for up to 3 Temporary Banner Permits per calendar year.
- Permitted banners must be displayed on a building and contained within the leased space of the business which obtains the permit. If unique circumstances exist, alternative locations may be approved by the City's Development Services Department.

All other types of temporary signs are PROHIBITED, including: flag banners, yard signs, air dancers, sign twirlers, and other moving signs.
